PRAISE Code - Rewarding positive behaviour and attitudes

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- We use our PRAISE Code for behaviour and rewards, and it signifies the values we expect and promote in our school.
- Each half term focuses on a different value within our PRAISE code.
- We reward positive behaviour and positive attitude to learning, demonstrating PRAISE with stamps.
- Students earn stamps in the following ways:

In Registration

Arriving on time, in correct uniform, fully equipped and on task

In Lessons

1 PRAISE stamps: Doing what is expected

2 PRAISE stamps: Putting in extra effort, completing a good piece of work and showing resilience

3 PRAISE stamps: The student has gone above and beyond in class, making significant additional effort and fully engaged in the lesson. Reserved for exceptional performance.

Additional stamps are used as rewards in and around the building for demonstrating the core values of our PRAISE code

If a student is not following school expectations, we have the following behaviour system:

C1 - Verbal warning

C2 - Second verbal warning. Further transgression leads to a C3

C3 – This is a documented written warning on SIMS

- Receiving three of these in a week will lead to a detention. KS3 students get these recorded in their planners.
- A C3 can be issued without going through a C1/2 if the behaviour warrants. (throwing a pen will be an instant C3 for example)
- If a pupil has been through the PRAISE code, C1-3, timeout and the behaviour persists, they will be issued a red card. They will leave the lesson.
- Again, red cards can be issued without prior cautions.

At Key Stage 4 we will offer a broad range of subjects that will prepare pupils for further education and the world of work post 16.





The Options timeline


- 15.10.24: Introductory Options assembly by JHA/KBI







