<p><b>Peer mentoring</b></p>	<p><b>Children NE Youth Link – Peer Mentoring programme:</b>          Youth Link is the name for Children NE young people’s peer mentoring service. Youth Link helps to improve communication and relationships between young people (aged 12 to 18 years old) and their school and families. It helps young people to strengthen their confidence and self-esteem. Young people are matched with a trained volunteer (who is usually just a few years older) who will help them to look at their difficulties and help them come up with solutions to problems they have. Children NE can work with your school to provide a bespoke peer mentoring support package based on the needs and goals you wish to achieve for your students.
